



# HOW TO MANUAL FOR STUDENTS

## Similarity check and Assignment Submission: Using Turnitin for assignments submitted in TISS OL



- Login to your TISSOL account
- Click on specific course that you wish to work on
- In this case, we have clicked on course “Knowledge Management”
- Each course has several topics / weeks listed
- Faculty will add assignments under these topics.
- Under each assignment, there is provision to check similarity / plagiarism level.



- Click on “Similarity Check Turnitin Link, a submission page opens up.



- Click on “Submit Paper” button at the bottom.
- Fill assignment details and add it by browsing and uploading same

- If you click on similarity level percentage/Colour code, you will see the assignment text alongwith sources of similarity in colour codes.
- This will help you to revise assignment to improve the originality.

We are living in a knowledge society, which is dominated by information in its most diverse formats. Internet and digital information sources have provided us with wealth of information in abundance. This means that health professionals are increasingly finding that they have more information available than they can handle with confidence in their busy time schedules and the hardest task now is to actually locate the information required from the flood of information received. Major problem appears to be the difficulty of identifying and filtering the most useful, accurate and credible sources while searching online for health information.

This study focuses on capacity building of health professionals in non-government organisations in terms of access to quality health information needed for performing their duties. Though there are many studies involving the need assessment in health studies in general, there are not many studies available, particularly involving health professionals, in NGOs.

Information Need Assessment and Information Skill Training for Health Professionals in NGOs, an area that has previously had little research attention. Information skill training in other settings than library and government organizations, in particular with the Non-Government Organizations has mainly been concerned with and focused on information needs and uses. The methodology employed will focus primarily on quantitative and later qualitative investigation in order to explore the nature of Health NGO's information needs and Skill training, information infrastructure and to build the information literacy model for Health Professionals.

One major expected outcome of this research would be a policy document


