 - Font: Times New Roman, Size: 12 pt, Line Spacing: 1.5
 - Abstract: 250–300 words with 4–6 keywords
 - Word Limit: Up to 4,000 words (excluding references)
- Referencing Style: APA
- Submit papers in MS Word format.

 - challenges in the LIS field.

2. Research Contributions:

- Number of research publications in UGC-recognized journals over the past 5 years.
- Citations received for faculty and student publications.

3. Placement Record:

- A strong placement track record for graduates over the last 5 years, demonstrating the school's success in preparing students for the workforce.
- 4. Commitment to Professional Engagement:
 - A minimum of two registered participants from the school attending TISS-IATLIS Conference 2025, reflecting the school's dedication to supporting and encouraging participation in professional events and academic networking.

Submit a detailed nomination addressing the criteria mentioned, along with the following:

- A description of how the school's curriculum is innovative and aligned with the NEP.
- A list of research publications and citation metrics.
- Placement statistics for the last 5 years.
- Names and registration details of participants attending the TISS IATLIS National Conference 2025.

Announcement of IATLIS Awards

Indian Association of Teachers of Library and Information Science (IATLIS) invites nominations from LIS teachers /professionals /researchers for the following awards:

- IATLIS Motiwale Best LIS Teacher Award
- IATLIS Prof. S.P. Narang Research Promotion Award (For Researcher)
- IATLIS Prof. Jagindar Singh Ramdev Lifetime Achievement Award
- IATLIS- Mrs. Ratna Laxman Rao Best Woman LIS Teacher/ Professional Award

A. Eligibility for IATLIS – Motiwale Best LIS Teacher Award

Executive Council Members of IATLIS are not eligible to be nominated for these awards. The nominee should have at least 10 years of

teaching experience at the post-graduate level or 10 years professional experience at a senior level, and should be in service. A person can receive the award only once and one person can nominate only one LIS teacher / professional for each award at a time.

B. Eligibility criteria for IATLIS - Prof. S.P. Narang Research Promotion Award to be given every alternate year to an LIS Researcher

For this year's award, only nominations of students registered for a Ph.D. program at a recognized university will be considered. The nominee must not be a full-time employee. Nominations should be submitted on plain paper, accompanied by the nominee's bio-data, a progress report of their research work, and any research papers (published or accepted for publication), if applicable.







C. Eligibility criteria for IATLIS – Prof. Jagindar Singh Ramdev Lifetime Achievement Award:

A very senior/retired LIS teacher/professional/researcher who has made profound contribution to library education, research, training, literature, and practice.

Claims must be supported with documentary proof. Award can be given to a deserving person even if not applied. Award won't be given if no one is found suitable.

D. Eligibility criteria for IATLIS – Mrs. Ratna Laxman Rao Best Woman LIS Teacher / Professional Award

Executive Council Members of IATLIS are not eligible to be nominated for these awards. The nominee should have at least 10 years of teaching experience at the post-graduate level or 10 years professional experience at a senior level, and should be in service.

Submission Guidelines:

- A person can receive the award only once and one person can nominate only one LIS teacher / professional at a time.
- Nominations on plain paper should be accompanied by bio-data, list of publications, details of professional activities, and contribution to IATLIS activities.
- Executive Council Members of IATLIS are not eligible to be nominated for these awards.








- The nominee should have at least 10 years of teaching experience at the post-graduate level or 10 years professional experience at a senior level, and should be in service.

Academic Programmes of SDTM Library

The Sir Dorabji Tata Memorial Library at TISS is renowned for its innovative initiatives and capacity-building programs. In 2011, the **Centre for Library and Information Management Studies (CLIMS)** was established to offer academic programs in Library and Information Science.

In alignment with the *National Education Policy (NEP) 2020*, the CLIMS has revised its syllabus for all academic programs to ensure a future-ready, multidisciplinary approach.Currently, the library offers the following programs:

1. PG Diploma in Digital Library and Information Management

Launched in 2010, this one-year dual-mode program includes two semesters with 3 weeks of on-campus contact classes and 15 weeks of elearning per semester. Conducted at the Mumbai campus, the program accommodates 25 students annually. This cutting-edge program has successfully graduated 13 batches, providing a proven track record of its success.

2. Master of Library and Information Science (MLIS)

Introduced in 2013, this full-time, 80-credit master's program admits 15 students annually. It includes 24 core courses, an internship, a capstone project and a dissertation. Designed to meet the growing demand for skilled librarians adept at integrating ICT into learning, it offers promising career prospects.

3. Doctor of Philosophy (PhD)


Launched in 2012, the PhD program has drawn significant interest from professionals in various sectors, including NGOs, schools, and academic libraries. The program has successfully awarded 13 Ph.Ds with 12 more candidates currently engaged in their Ph.Ds at various stages.





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
